Race Numbers & Merchandise

Race Bib Collection

Every athlete in the Waterfront Half Marathon must wear their official race bib on the front of their top.

If you entered with an AHMS Series Pass, you already have your race bib and are good to go.

If not, you'll need to collect your race bib in person from Vellenoweth Green, St Heliers on race weekend.

Collection times:

Saturday, April 11

1:00pm – 4:00pm

Sunday, April 12 (Race Day)

From 5:30am – 21km athletes only

From 7:00am – 10km, 5km and 2km athletes

If you registered during race week, head to the Late Pickup line. Otherwise, line up according to your surname.

Singlet Collection

All single race 21km & 10km entrants can collect a free 2026 Waterfront Half Marathon singlet.

If you selected one, your singlet size will be printed on your race bib. Head to the yellow Singlet Collection tents, show your bib, and your singlet will be handed over.

Please note: no size swaps.

If you want to wear your singlet on race day, **make sure you register and collect it on Saturday.**

Late Entries

The 2026 ASICS Waterfront Half Marathon **is a complete sell-out event**, and no on-the-day entries will be available.

If you haven't already entered, please do not come to the venue expecting entry to be available.

Merchandise Collection

If you ordered merchandise, it can be collected from the orange Merch tent at the race venue:

Saturday: 1:00pm – 4:00pm

Race Day: from 7:30am

Just show your race number at the tent.

Your Race Bib

You must not take part in the event unless you are wearing an official race bib registered in your name.

You must not let anyone else use your race number unless it has been officially transferred to them through the my.runningevents portal.

Anyone found breaching this rule may be disqualified and could face a lifetime ban from our events.

Getting ready to race

Toilets

Toilet locations are marked on the venue map later in this Race Guide.

We strongly encourage all participants - especially those in the Half Marathon - to use a toilet before arriving at the venue where possible.

Race Number

Your official race number, with timing tag attached to the back, must be worn on the front of your top throughout the event.

Do not fold or crumple the electronic tag.

Keep your bib after you finish if you want to be included in the spot prize draw.

Competitive Walk

To be included in the 21km or 10km Competitive Walk results, athletes must be entered in the CW category, start on the designated walk start gun, and walk at all times while completing the course.

Walkers will begin approximately 3–5 minutes after runners, so listen carefully for announcements.

Gear Drop & Key Check

A self-service Gear Drop area will be located behind the Race Pack Pickup tents.

Show your race number to enter and exit via the red Gear Drop tents, then place your bag in one of the numbered aisles.

If you only have keys to leave, a Key Drop container will be available at the entrance.

To speed things up, please arrive with your bag or keys already labelled with your race number.

Half Marathon Course Detail

The Half Marathon course at the Waterfront Half Marathon breaks into four key sections: The Beaches, The Causeway, the Downtown Loop, and on the return leg, the Ngapipi Boatsheds out-and-back.

Important: This course has been officially measured and is World Athletics / AIMS Certified as accurate.

KM 0 / The Start

The race begins on Tamaki Drive in central St Heliers, near Goldie St and just metres from the main event venue and finish line. With the sun rising over the Waitematā Harbour and Rangitoto behind you, it's a spectacular place to start. Make sure you know your start zone and assembly time before race morning.

KM 0–5 / The Beaches

A short opening section takes you around the headland and into Kohimarama, where the first band appears opposite the Kohimarama Yacht Club and the 1km arch arrives quickly. There is a public toilet just past 1km.

Approaching 2km, the turn around Pipimea Head opens up views of Mission Bay and Bastion Point. You'll pass the Mission Bay shops, cafés and famous fountain — the old finish line from 2018–2025. Just beyond it is the first aid station and another public toilet.

From there, the course wraps around Bastion Point, with more live music near Tāmaki Yacht Club, before opening up your first clear look at downtown Auckland. You'll head past Okahu Bay Wharf and Kelly Tarlton's, then through Okahu Bay where another aid station and toilet sit mid-bay. At 5km, opposite Ferg's Kayaks, you are one quarter of the way done.

KM 5–7.5 / The Causeway

Leaving Okahu Bay, Tāmaki Drive opens out. You'll cross the Ngapipi overbridge — short and gentle rather than daunting — and move onto the causeway between Hobson Bay and the Waitematā Harbour.

At 6km, boats line one side while harbour views stretch out on the other. Near the Parnell overbridge you'll find another aid station and the 7km arch. Up ahead, the road rises slightly over the rail overpass into the city, rewarded with one of the best skyline views on the course.

KM 8–12 / Downtown Loop

Passing under the 8km arch, you head into the city with the Ports of Auckland on your right and Spark Arena on your left. By 9km, you're fully city-bound on Quay Street.

Just before the Ferry Building, the course turns through the red gates onto Queens Wharf. You'll run between The Cloud and Shed 10 to the end of the wharf before looping back out to Quay Street. From there, the route brushes the Ferry Building again, heads through Te Komititanga, then winds through Galway Street, Takutai Square, Tyler Street and Commerce Street before returning to Quay Street and beginning the run back east.

KM 11–14.3 / Heading Back East

You'll retrace your steps past Spark Arena, over the Parnell overpass, through Mechanics Bay, and back across the causeway toward the Ngapipi bridge.

KM 14.3–15.3 / Ngapipi Boatsheds

After the bridge, the course turns into Ngapipi Road for a flat, fast 1km out-and-back along the edge of Whakatakataka Bay. Early in the section, you'll pass the iconic Ngapipi Boatsheds — heritage-protected waterfront buildings that have become some of Auckland's most exclusive addresses.

The turnaround sits outside number 10. On the way back, you'll pass under the 15km arch and timing point before turning right onto Tāmaki Drive for the final stretch to St Heliers.

KM 15.3–21 / The Run Home

From there, it's a straight retrace through Okahu Bay, Mission Bay, Kohimarama and back into St Heliers.

KM 21.1 / The Finish

After the final live entertainment point at the eastern end of Kohimarama, you'll round the corner into St Heliers and hear the finish line ahead. Stay focused as you leave the road and transition onto the grass reserve. The finish chute is lined with spectators, with Rangitoto perfectly framed behind for a memorable finish-line photo.

Get your hands in the air — you made it.

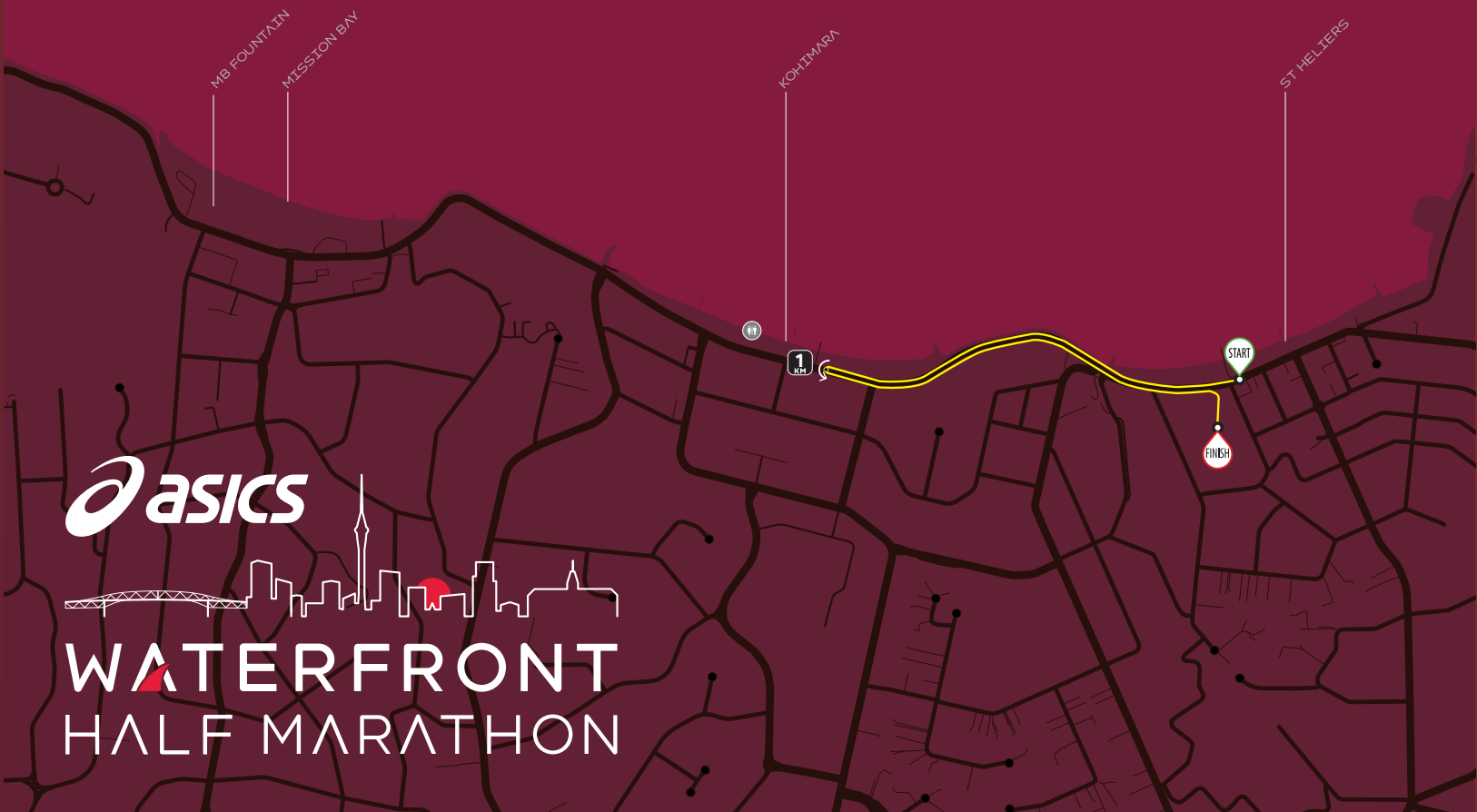

You're finished, now what?

Finisher Medal

The only fitting reward after your extraordinary effort is one of our beautiful Waterfront Half Marathon finisher medals. Collect from the table at the end of the finish chute.

Grand Slam Medal

If you qualified for the Grand Slam, your award can be collected from the yellow tent next to MERCH.

Please make sure you check your name on the Grand Slam Qualifiers list on the AHMS website before race day.

No list = no award.

Refuelling

As you leave the finish chute, you'll receive a can of Vista drink and a banana.

Water will also be available at the tent just outside the chute.

Reward Yourself

Got time before the awards? Have a wander through vendor village and check out brands including ASICS, Garmin, Goodr, Feetures, Ultimate Direction, Lorna Jane and The Running Store.

Awards & Spot Prizes

The Awards Ceremony starts at 10:30am sharp on the main stage.

Come along to celebrate some of the standout performances of the day, and you could also take home a share of over \$5,000 in spot prizes.

To be eligible for spot prizes, you must be present in person and register on the spot prize mats.

The awards ceremony will run for approximately 45 minutes.
